LOCKERS: Each student will be issued a locker near homeroom with a built-in padlock. No additional lock needed or allowed. The locker is the same size as at ARIS: 14" wide x 10.5" deep x 35" high. Students should use their lockers and not attempt to carry everything around with them all day. Students have a 20 minute lunch followed by a 20 minute study/break period that is the perfect time to exchange morning items for afternoon. A locker shelf is recommended for those who like to keep things well-organized.

BACKPACKS: Students are permitted to carry bags in school. However, students must use their lockers and should not expect to carry everything around all day. A small backpack or drawstring bag is generally more that sufficient for students. A backpack with a sleeve for laptops/chromebook is ideal. A backpack should NOT have wheels or handles. That's luggage and not permitted.

TECHNOLOGY: All students in grades 5-12 are issued an Acer c720p Chromebook (dim: 11.6" x 8" x 0.8"). The device does NOT come with a bag. It is HIGHLY recommended that students purchase some protective bag or sleeve for the device. Students will also need a set of earphones or earbuds. It is recommended to have a spare pair beyond what the student may already own. Although technology allows us to move toward more and more paperless assignments, there will still be a need for students to print documents from time to time. Having access to a printer at home is still a necessity. Internet access at home is not essential, but certainly convenient for students in managing their work. Families without Internet access at home may qualify for assistance programs through local cable Internet providers or may contact our computer resource/support teachers at HMS for additional assistance.

PHYS. ED.: Students will change for PE at HMS. There is no specific PE uniform, although the HMS Home & School Association does sell sport shorts and t-shirts with Hillsborough colors and logo. Typical sports shorts and plain t-shirts are acceptable for PE. Students will need a **padlock** to secure personal belongings in temporary lockers in the locker-rooms. A drawstring bag can also be useful to help carry gym clothes and a padlock to and from PE class.

SUPPLIES FOR SCHOOL: As students enter the secondary level, they interact with many more teachers and an increasing diversity and complexity of courses. The specific supplies for each class will vary and change over time as technology becomes increasingly more embedded into the fabric of education as well. One teacher may suggest 1" binder where another may suggest 1.5". One may suggest 5 tabs and another 8. Stocking up on a variety of general office supplies now can serve a student this year and into the future. The "requirements" from individual teachers can guide them and help teach good organizational skills. There are some specific items that may indeed be a requirement for a particular course. Ultimately, however, students must explore for themselves and determine what methods and materials work best for them. Give guidance and advice, but also understand how your child works and what best fits his or her learning and organizational style.

SUPPLIES FOR HOME: Students at this age should have a regular workspace at home with general office supplies to support their school work (e.g. pens/pencils, stapler, ruler, highlighters, paper, 3-hole punch, post-it notes, markers, glue/scissors, etc.) that includes access to the Internet and a printer.
